Teacher views on GCSE maths tiering

In the run up to the first exams in the new GCSE maths last year, we knew that one of the issues worrying schools was choices about which tier to enter students for. In early 2017, we asked GCSE maths teachers about their tier entry choices for the first award of the new 9 to 1 graded qualifications. Ahead of this summer's exams, we've repeated this exercise to find out what schools are planning in 2018.

We have also re-visited some of the same schools we spoke to last year, ahead of this year's awards, and spoken to them about their experiences last summer. They told us that the results they received last summer were broadly as expected, and similar to their results in the old qualifications. This reassured them that they had made appropriate tier choices.
