

Year 8 girls at The Buckingham School competed in a brand new competition launched by England's National Cyber Security Centre (NCS), in which students showcased their independence and problem solving in four key cyber areas: Logics and Coding, Cryptography, Networking and Cybersecurity. The content for each category of the competition is consistent with subjects within the Computer Science syllabus from the National Curriculum. However, the competition contained some advanced cyber topics that are not covered in traditional education but with the purpose of stretching the lateral thinking and cyber knowledge of the teams. The girls organised themselves into teams (most choosing to compete with their Forms) and attended the competition sessions every lunchtime from January 29th to February 2nd. Alan Turing Cryptography Competition

Do you like breaking codes and solving ciphers? Can you, and your friends, unravel the Morphogenesis Mystery? Would you like the chance to use your mathematical skills to win some great prizes?

Then, the Alan Turing Cryptography Competition is for you!

Now in its seventh year, the Alan Turing Cryptography Competition is aimed at secondary school children up to Year 11. You don't need to be a computer whizz or a mathematical genius - you just need to keep your wits about you and be good at solving problems!

The competition is organised by the School of Mathematics at the University of Manchester and The Buckingham School Computing Club has been investigating key cryptographic techniques to decipher the mysterious clues the competition has been providing each week. So far, we've been able to keep on top of the clues and have broken the first two clues, using a variety of methods from context clues to online tools and research. What is the seventh word?





Race for the Line Update







This year, all Year 7 students are competing in a cross-curricular project known as "Race for the Line", in which students are asked to design, build and test their own rocket car!

To help all students understand the key design concepts of the car, we had STEM Ambassador, Chris Herbert, in to provide some helpful tips.

Chris Herbert runs D2H Aero. The D2H group of companies specialise in aerodynamic research and development, engineering design and analysis combined with a highly developed skill base in race car engineering analysis and toolset development.

His past work includes Redbull Racing, Toyota Motorsport and with England's Olympic Cycling Team at Rio – all his work relates to the aspects of aerodynamics.

Innovate Bucks 2018

To encourage innovation, problem solving and invention skills, Buckinghamshire Skills Hub and STEM NOW have joined forces to bring you an exciting STEM challenge for Years 7 and 8 – which also includes a great opportunity to raise money the school. This STEM challenge is being mentored by Ms. Townes (Computing) and Mr Wise (Science).

Overview:

In teams of five to ten students from Year 7 and/or Year 8, need to work together to design a game or activity. The game should:

Be based on a science-related theme, such as space or the environment, with students encouraged to think creatively around this;

Involve a basic electronics system (included in the Micro:bit Starter Kit Cost purchased with the small signup fee). Students can use any materials, but might include, for instance, off-cuts from the DT Lab.

The challenge is designed to run over the course of the Spring Term, culminating with the games being used in the Summer Term. The team which generates the most revenue wins, with prizes for the winning team of each school and also a Buckinghamshire county winner. There may also be additional prizes for creativity, innovation, design and execution.

Students discovered how the physics they study in the classroom is an integral part of the work engineers undertake in the RAF and other engineering organisations. The Roadshow was fun and a brilliant illustration of exciting careers in STEM.
