The Centre for Computing History

Fourteen Key Stage 3 students travelled to The Centre for Computing History in Cambridge on Thursday, 12 October 2017 to attend an IT event which was part of the Centre's festival 'Computing History: Where did all the Women Go?" The event aimed to encourage girls to engage with technology and STEM. This was an evening event starting with a live play of Ada Lovelace, followed by a STEM networking session; focusing on women from the past and women currently working in STEM fields. Ada Lovelace wrote the world's first complex algorithm in 1843 and was then written out of history. The performance told her story using an LED dress which was operated live on stage, using her wearable tech satin glove. Ada.Ada.Ada exists to help people, especially girls and women, engage with technology and stem as a career. The event explained why everyone should get involved with computers to help

We are proud to be an Ofsted Good School in ALL aspects of Inspection.




English Department - Young Writer's Competition

Bikeability Level 2

Eight of our Year 7 students have taken part in Level 2 Bikeability training. Level 2 Bikeability takes place on local roads, giving students a real cycling experience.

The students started the first day by practicing some key skills on the MUGA before moving out onto local roads and dealing with traffic on short journeys. All of the students were trained on and experienced a variety of key skills, including how to do the following:

- Start and finish a journey by road, including passing parked or slower moving vehicles and side roads
- Identify and react to hazards in the road
- Signal their intentions to other road users when someone needs to know what they're doing
- Understand where to ride on the road
- Use junctions, including turning left and right into major and minor roads
- Use the Highway Code, particularly when it comes to understanding road signs

We are delighted to say that all eight students not only completed the course but passed too!

Keep a look out on ParentMail for details of our forthcoming Level 3 course, also, primarily, for Year 7 students. Level 3 equips trainees with skills for more challenging roads and traffic situations – busier streets, queuing traffic, complex junctions and roundabouts. It also includes planning routes for safe cycling. Places on the course are limited and will be allocated on a first come, first served basis.

The objective of the collaboration is to bring students relevance to the industry today and in particular, the challenges on the future of the workplace such as Robotics, Automation and Cyber Security. Mr Drakard will bring career network and experience to students to help prepare them for the world outside school by hosting CV workshops and hosting interview workshops. The intention is also to bring key business leaders to The Buckingham School to talk about their industry.

After the half term break, we will be launching a speaking event where students present well-formed ideas in under 20 minutes on the subject of "Challenges of being a student in 2017". This will include a 60 second vlog to introduce the student and topic. The vlog will be uploaded online ready for the school community to vote for their favourite. Each student will be allocated a mentor to help with the presentation creation and pitch.
