Students at The Buckingham School have achieved encouraging results in their GCSE exams.

We are today celebrating some of the best Ebacc results the school has ever had.

We have seen many students not only attaining high grades but, making significantly more progress than the national average.

The school is proud of its Science outcomes with continued growth in grade 5s (A*-B equivalent) in Biology, Chemistry and Physics -21%, 10% and 10% increases respectively, on last year.

Eight subjects have shown significant improvement in attaining the highest 7+ / A*-A grades. We are pleased to report the majority of subjects have improved in A*-C / 4+ / D*-D grades.

Among many delighted students celebrating today:

- Archie Fisher achieved an amazing nine 7+ / A*-A (equivalent) grades, including seven grade 8s in Biology, Chemistry, Physics, English Literature, History, Geography and Religious Studies.
- Maia Green achieved a fantastic eight 7+ / A*-A (equivalent) grades, including a grade 9 in English Literature, two grade 8s in History and Maths and five grade 7s in English Language, Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Art.
- Katie Thrift gained eight 7+ / A*-A (equivalent) grades, including a grade 9 in Biology, three grade 8s in Maths, History and PE.
- James MacAleese achieved an amazing ten GCSEs, including three grade 9s in Physics, Chemistry and Computer Science.

We are tremendously proud of all of our students who have done so well.
