Subject: Personal Development

Year group: Year 11

Periods per fortnight: 1 x PSHE

INTENT:

What does Enrichment mean? Allowing students to develop their skills, broaden their experiences and prepare them for future success.

What does PSHE mean? Allowing students "to develop the knowledge, skills and attributes they need to keep themselves healthy and safe, and prepare for life and work in modern Britain" (PSHE Association).

Personal Development in year 11 enables students to explore previously studied topics in greater detail in order to broaden their understanding and knowledge. Students are also introduced to new themes in order to support them in being prepared for life once they have left The Buckingham School.

The intent of the Personal Development curriculum is to "support pupils to develop in many diverse aspects of life" (Ofsted). The aim is to prepare pupils for their adult life and to support them in becoming respectful and responsible members of society. The promotion of the school virtues (ambition, curiosity, empathy, respect, confidence, resilience and integrity) is a key focus of the Personal Development curriculum.
