Activating Accounts

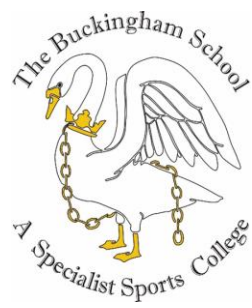

Eight ways to get the most out of your pods...



Watch the Pod once and then list 5 or more pieces of information from memory. Watch a second time and note the number you got right. Aim to better this number each time.



Write a summary of the Pod. Select the key points and, if you can, quote the Pod directly. Aim to write two paragraphs or 12 bullet points.



Pause the Pod as you're watching and copy into your book any pictures or labelled diagrams.



Write down 5 questions to test yourself on next time you open your Pod book.



Create an idea map or spider diagram for the Pod. Place the topic, key concept, character etc. at the centre and map information around it - being creative and colourful can help you picture the map later.



Write an exam-style question based on the topic of the Pod then answer the question in full as you will in the real exam. If you need to, use the Pod to help you.



Work with a friend; each watch a different Pod then teach each other what you've learnt. Make notes about what you're going to teach and what you've learned. Afterwards compare your notes.



Make notes whilst you watch a Pod. Read them straight after and highlight or rank the information in order of importance.
