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WORK EXPERIENCE

Arrange VWex in half-term and beyond

Keep young people focused on developing their future goals by taking up virtual work experience placements this February half-term and beyond.

Experience in the physical workplace is difficult due to COVID-19 restrictions, but many employers now offer virtual alternatives: read more on Prospects.

Do encourage young people to search and apply for placements now. Check if any age or geographical restrictions apply: they are often for 16+. Those listed below are all free unless specified.



General placements:

- Speakers for Schools: register now for live • opportunities this half-term, currently featuring Willmott Dixon construction, the RAF, NHS nursing and more.
- Springpod: sign into view live opportunities this half-term ranging from law to Vodafone
- The Forage: learn career skills from Fortune 500 companies law, accounting, finance, engineering and more.
- Student Ladder: an overview of opportunities for 16-18 year olds •
- Barclays Lifeskills: learn general employability skills while spending a day with a digital agency •
- A lighter take on work experience: watch comedian Rhod Gilbert on the BBC as he tries out work experience • placements in a variety of roles or experience The Nine to Five with Stacey Dooley
- iDEA: the Inspiring Digital Enterprise Award helps develop digital, enterprise and employability skills for free through online challenges.
- Investin (PAID FOR): 12-18 year olds can experience role-plays, seminars, simulations and networking sessions for 20 popular careers. £135/student for one-day programmes: use 'GROUP10' for 10% discount.
- Careerdays (PAID FOR): One-day tasters in medicine, veterinary practice, dentistry, law, midwifery, business, psychology, performing arts costing £59 (bursaries available).

Industry sector spotlight: Healthcare and medical technology

Each area of the economy has a different story to tell. We'll take a look in each issue at a sector where job opportunities are growing: this month we feature healthcare and medical technology.

• **Nationally** ... Did you know that the largest employer in the UK healthcare sector is the NHS, which employs more than 1.5 million people – placing it in the top five largest workforces in the world? We've all heard of doctor, nurse and physiotherapists, but did you know there are more than 350 different roles available within the NHS? <u>Try this 5 minute quiz</u> to see which one might suit you.

• Locally ... In Buckinghamshire, the position of registered general nurse was the highest job in demand in 2020, while 'health and social work' formed the second biggest employment sector.

<u>Buckinghamshire Healthcare NHS Trust</u> employs around 6,000 doctors, nurses, midwives, health visitors, therapists, healthcare scientists and other support staff caring for more than half a million patients every year. The Trust provides care in people's homes, from five community hospitals and from two acute hospitals. Stoke Mandeville Hospital is home to the UK's National Spinal Injuries Centre.

Medical technology or 'medtech' is also a growth area: from syringes, artificial limbs and implants (like hip replacements) to complex hospital equipment and devices which diagnose or treat patients (such as scanners or pacemakers). Research careers such as: biochemist, laboratory technicians, data scientist, virtual reality developer, artificial intelligence engineer.
