Year 10 Duke of Edinburgh Silver Award 2019

As you are aware, your child is well underway with their Duke of Edinburgh Award. A compulsory section of the award is the expedition. During the summer term, students have to complete two compulsory expeditions (Practise and Qualifying) which include three days walking and two evenings camping.

Practice Expedition

Qualifying Expedition

Date: 10th, 11thth,12th July 2019 <u>Drop off Location and Time</u>: Arrive at school at 8.15am with all equipment Location: Oxfordshire Campsite details: Night 1: Cotsworld View campsite, Charlbury, Chipping Norton OX7 3JH Night 2: Chipping Norton camping and Caravan Park, Chipping Norton Rd, Chadlington, Chipping Norton OX7 3PE <u>Pick up</u>: at school at 4.45pm

Students MUST have completed all other sections of their Duke of Edinburgh to be allowed to go on the Qualifying Expedition. Students were aware of this stipulation at the beginning of the course and were reminded at each of the training sessions. These sections must be signed off by their Assessor, evidence uploaded and sent to be signed off on the Duke of Edinburgh website. Please encourage your child to ensure that these sections are complete.

For each expedition, students are expected to be fully equipped both with individual items and group items. Students have completed a session on kit so understand the requirements. There is also a recommended kit list and videos regarding kit on their Google Classroom.

Please do not feel that you need to go and purchase all items on the kit list. We have a small number of tents and *trangias* that can be hired from school at a small cost. Students will need to see Miss Vaill for a hire form. There is also a Duke of Edinburgh Kit Store at Green Park,

Aylesbury, where all kits can be hired. If you are choosing this option, you will need to organise this yourself, directly with Green Park.

For each expedition, students must use their camp craft skills to cook their evening meal and breakfast. All students have been given a guideline sheet on the type of food that they should consume during their expedition. Students will have created their own menu for their expedition for you to see. For lunch on each day, students can come with readymade lunches they have made at home. They must have a water bottle and carry enough fluid for each day's walking (although they will be able to refill at the campsite overnight).

Students are placed within expedition groups and must work out how they are going to share the weight of any shared item, for example: tent share (4 man tent max), cooking stove etc., so please don't be alarmed if students only have the poles to carry in their back pack. Students are responsible for carrying <u>ALL</u> equipment and remember the heavier the bag the harder the walk!

The expedition will be supervised by staff from The Buckingham School; however, students will be walking unaccompanied most of the time. Staff will be present around the area, meeting your child at pre-agreed checkpoints and will be present at the campsite throughout the night.

For it to be a true Duke of Edinburgh experience, only a couple of students in each team are permitted to carry mobile phones for **emergency use only**. They must be turned off during the whole expedition and kept in a sealed bag. If **used inappropriately, students will fail the expedition section of their award**. Students will not be allowed to use headphones for *ipods* etc., to listen to music during the expedition as this is a health and safety hazard.

We endeavour to keep costs to a minimum, which includes transport for both expeditions, camp fees, trackers and insurance. The full cost of the expeditions is **£80**.
