Isabelle Ford recently swam at a County swimming gala at AquaVale in Aylesbury.


"I was in a relay team of four swimming IM (Individual Medley) and Front Crawl. We came first in both events.


World Book Day Challenge

Have you registered yet?

ParentMail will be beneficial to you because:- messages will get to you reliably and on time; we can send messages directly to mums, dads and other carers at the same time; you will be able to read and respond to school messages at work, home or on the go; emergency or important information can be sent by text message; iPhone and Android Apps available (free to download), all messages will be in one place. You will be able to use features such as ParentMail's online booking system for Parents Evenings and at a later date we will be using +Pay on ParentMail which allows you to pay for school items.

To download the App for free from either the Apple APP store or the Google Play Store simply search Buckingham School ParentMail. Please note, you will need to be registered on ParentMail in order to access the App.


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The Buckingham School and United World Schools

An update on The Buckingham School's Partnership with Mae Yay School in Myanmar

Since becoming a partner school with UWS (in 2015) we have raised around £2000 though various fundraising and have been in regular contact with the UWS team. United World Schools communicate with us on a regular basis providing updates and to tell us about future ideas and plans we have.

An UWS Update:

We wanted to send you a quick update from Mae Yay village where the school continues to thrive. The photo (above right) which our school Manager sent through shows a typical house which is raised off the ground to stop everything getting wet in the monsoon and is open to allow the flow of air during the peak of summer.

As you'll have heard in the news, there have been huge ethnic conflicts across the Shan State and some appalling persecutions, particularly of the Rohingya people in the nearby Rakhine State. In Mae Yay, the whole village are the same tribe so ethnic divisions are not an issue. However, it has meant travelling in the region is much harder and our team have even seen government tanks at the bottom of the valley. Christianity is the second biggest religion in Myanmar and all schools must close for two weeks to allow those children who choose to, to celebrate Christmas. This is very different to our Christmas celebrations. For those who celebrate Christmas, the fortnight will be a chance for families to get together and eat speciality foods.

It goes without saying that the school's progress would not be possible without the continued support of schools like The Buckingham School. It's fantastic to see how many children are now attending the school each day and we look forward to keeping you updated on the school's progress in the new year.

Noticing that the children are playing with Duplo we thought that perhaps this is something we can send. The people of UWS also agreed as they wrote to us:

"We struggle to take physical donations into the village as it often means that someone else local loses out i.e when we bring in clothes it means that a local provider is out of a job. The only exception is Duplo. This is really expensive in Myanmar and unattainable in the village, it is also indestructible. If you were able to do a Duplo collection that would be much appreciated."

So, we are looking for any possible Duplo donations that you will be willing to part ways with.

If you have Duplo at home and it is not being used and you and your family are willing to give it to us so we can send it to Mae Yay that would be fantastic! Perhaps you can donate some of your collection and not all of it.. Thank you to those of you who have already given us some Duplo!

We have 8 students who already have received offers from the prestigious Russell Group (a group of the country's top universities), 9 students have received unconditional offers, which means they want those students regardless of results.

It is amazing how quickly time flies, the UCAS window opens on 1 June for our current Year 12s to apply for University places!!

In early June Year 12s will be offered the opportunity to attend a UCAS conference at the University of Bedfordshire, a fantastic trip, more details coming soon!

Nine of our Year 13 students are currently applying for various apprenticeships in very different fields such as Business, Quantity Surveying, Photography, Carer, Primary School, BBC, Mercedes-Benz, Sports Journalism and BMW.


