 Students contribute to our community in a variety of ways and we are immensely proud of the charitable work undertaken by our fundraisers.
- Is open for breakfast and after school homework and revision clubs.

- Offers opportunities available in conjunction with business/sporting mentors and organisations. The school has strong links with Buckingham University.
- Organises over 60 educational trips and visits each academic year (including overseas).

Key Results for Academic Year 2018/19

A Level Results

- A Level Psychology shows continued strength with 53% of students achieving A*-B grades.
- The vocational courses also continue to be a real strength of the school with the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) excelling. We are particularly pleased with 75% of students achieving A*-B grades.
- The Extended Project is a single piece of work requiring a high degree of planning, preparation, research and autonomous working. It takes the form of a dissertation and will require a detailed preparation/planning stage, the production of the report and a presentation that sums up the report. It has been praised by universities for guiding students into higher education and carries UCAS points.
- The school sees a number of subjects with a 100% pass rate, including Art, English Literature, Media, Psychology, BTEC Business Studies, Computer Science, Performing Arts and Sports.
- We have a significant number of students (52% of the cohort) who applied for university and obtained their first choice preference.
- A high percentage of students have commenced on highly competitive apprenticeship
 programmes, which is a fantastic way to start building the foundations of a young person's
 chosen career path. Alongside this, it is great to see one of our students taking the new
 degree Apprenticeship.

GCSE outcomes

- As a non-selective school in a heavily selective area, we prepare students for the full range of outcomes. We are delighted that students have achieved top Grade 9s in 12 subjects, with significant numbers of results at Grades 7-9. On its debut, 15% of GCSE Psychology students achieved a Grade 9.
- We celebrate all of our students' successes and we are delighted that the number of students
 achieving 5 or more Grade 4s and above (including English and Maths) has increased by 8.5%
 since last year to 64.3%. Grades at 5 or above have increased in Maths and the number of
 students achieving two or more Science grades at Grade 5 and above has also increased.
- In its debut at KS4, Psychology has performed particularly well with 80% Grade 5s or above. Business Studies has also achieved this high percentage of Grade 5s or above, seeing a significant increase in attainment from last year.
