Subject: AQA GCSE MUSIC

## INTENT

To give students the opportunity to explore a range of musical genres and instruments through performance, composition, and listening activities:

Students will be expected to perform regularly in front of their peers giving and receiving constructive feedback.

Students are encouraged to be independent learners and given autonomy to be creative with their musical ideas.

Students will explore the elements of music (pitch, tempo, texture, timbre, dynamics, structure) through performance and composition work.

Students will learn to work in a range of group sizes.

## IMPACT:

Students will learn to have a strong rehearsal ethic encouraged through classwork and through continuous rehearsal students should be able to develop the resilience they need to produce the performances.

Students will learn throughout each unit of work key skills that they will be assessed in throughout each half term - Performance skills, composition skills, Group skills, personal management skills, appreciation, and use of key terms in music. These six skills enable students to become well rounded musicians and will allow students to develop the confidence to approach music in all aspects becoming well-rounded musicians.
