Curriculum Intent, Implementation and Impact 2019-20

Subject: AQA GCSE MUSIC

Year group: Y9

Periods per fortnight: 5

INTENT

Students will be assessed in three areas: Performing, composing, and understanding music over the GCSE course.

Students will develop and apply musical knowledge, understanding and skills to become well-rounded musicians.

Students will be expected to perform regularly in lessons as a soloist or an ensemble focusing on developing their performance skills and instrumental or vocal technique.

Students need to understand and be able to write about the elements of music (melody, articulation, dynamics, texture, structure, instrumentation, rhythm, tonality and harmony).

Through performance, composition and theory based lessons, the skills learned in these three areas represent our schools virtues where students will embed creativity, curiosity, respect, resilience, ambition, confidence, and integrity.

Curiosity is seen through the music we explore, creativity through composition, confidence building through performance skills, ambitious in improving the quality of their musical performance and respectful in their approach to the styles of music studied.
