What are we doing in lessons?

We will begin GCSE by entering the Young Geographer of the Year competition, after which we will commence GCSE studies looking at Biomes and Ecosystems, including Desertification

Topics and case studies

Students have a variety of case studies (in depth examples of places) for each of the ten topics. In the exam, questions related to these are worth either 6 or 8 marks and amounts to 26/70 marks on both Paper 1 and Paper 2, over a third of the papers! Getting these case studies right will make the biggest difference to students' grades.

Top 5 Targets, based on recent exams:


- 1. Make sure you break down the question correctly
- 2. Apply the correct case study to the topic area
- 3. Ensure you 'Assess and Evaluate' in the 6 and 8 mark questions.
- 4. Develop answers to obtain all available marks: Point Evidence Explain!
- 5. Spell geographical words correctly. These terms are often featured in the question.

What can the GCSE geographers be doing at home?

- Question-a-day revision
- Be an active learner –participate and get fully involved in the lessons to get the most out of them.
- Complete all work and undertake wider reading
- Create flashcards of facts and information for the examples/places listed above.
- Keep up to date with current events
