

Household Support Fund	https://www.gov.uk/guidance/cost-of- living-payment	Support for the most vulnerable to cover their essential daily costs, like energy bills. Recipients include pensioners and families with children.
Budgeting loans	https://www.gov.uk/budgeting-help- benefits	You may be eligible for a Budgeting Loan if you've been on certain benefits for 6 months. This can be used for household items, rent in advance and travelling costs.
Cheaper phone and broadband	telecoms-and-internet/advice-for- consumers/costs-and-billing/social-tariffs	You may be eligible to move onto a social tariff if you're struggling to afford your broadband or home phone services.
No contract mobile phone providers giffgaff	https://www.giffgaff.com/	If you are out of contract you can switch to a cheaper phone provider if you already have a hand set. £10 a month will get you unlimited phone calls, texts and 15GB of data.
Help with all or part of your rent	https://www.gov.uk/benefits-calculators	You may get help with all or part of your rent. There's no set amount of housing costs support and what you get will depend on whether you rent privately or from a council or housing association.
Universal Credit if unemployed or on low income	https://www.gov.uk/universal-credit	If you and/or your partner are responsible for paying rent for the home you live in, or if you have a mortgage, Universal Credit may provide help towards the cost.

Pensioner Cost of Living Payment	<u>https://www.gov.uk/winter-fuel-</u> payment	In the winter months pensioners can get between £100 and £300 to help pay heating bills. This winter, they will also receive an extra one -off £300 Pensioner Cost of Living Payment.
Council Tax Rebate	https://www.gov.uk/guidance/council- tax-rebate-factsheet	If you live in Council Tax bands A to D in England you'll get £150 back from your Council Tax bill (4 out of 5 households in England).
