Constitution	A set of rules that governs how a country works.
Constitutional monarchy	A form of government in which a monarch rules with limitations on their power.
Williamite	A supporter of William of Orange's claim to the thrones of the Kingdoms of England, Scotland and Ireland.
Counter-revolution	A revolution that tries to change or get rid of a government or system that was created by an earlier revolution.
Relevant	Something that matters in a situation or to a person.
Consent	Agreeing to something or giving permission for it.
Progress	Movement towards a goal, or to a further or higher stage.
Democracy	A system of government that gives everyone the same rights and freedoms, and allows the people to have a say in how the country is run, usually through voting in elections.

Dates	Key events
1688	The year in which the Glorious Revolution took place. In which James II was removed from the throne.
1689	The Bill of Rights was signed.
1 st July 1690	The Battle of the Boyne
12 th July 1691	The Battle of Aughrim

Key individuals	Why are they important?
James II	King of England from 1685 – 1688. He was removed for his Catholic beliefs, and due to fear his son would be Catholic.
Mary Stuart	Protestant daughter of James II. Deposed James with her husband, William of Orange.
William of Orange	The Protestant prince from the Netherlands. Husband of Mary Stuart.
