Key Words	Definitions
Chancellor of the Exchequer	The government's chief financial minister.
Coalition government	A government formed jointly by more than one political party.
First Lord of the Admiralty	A role in the British government that no longer exists. The holder of the role was the head of the Royal Navy.
Landslide victory	An election result where the victorious candidate wins by a huge margin.
Controversy	A dispute or argument in which people have strongly opposing views.
Eugenics	The discredited study of how to improve the human race through selective breeding.
Context	Background information that helps you to understand an event or a story.
Authorship	The source (such as the author) of a piece of writing.

Dates	Key events
1940	Churchill became Prime Minister for the first time
1951	Churchill became Prime Minister for the second time
24 th January 1965	Churchill died
30 th January 1965	Churchill's state funeral

Key individuals	Why are they important?
Winston Churchill	Inspirational statesman, leader, writer and speaker who led Britain to victory in the Second World War. He served as Conservative Prime Minister twice - from 1940 to 1945 and from 1951 to 1955
Neville Chamberlain	Prime Minister of the UK from 1937-1940
Clement Atlee	Prime Minister of the UK from 1945-1951
Anthony Eden	Prime Minister of the U after Churchill
