Green Schools Challenge

The Buckinghamshire Skills Hub and Buckinghamshire Council are pleased to be launching the third year of the Green Schools Challenge, supported by a number of businesses based in the county. The competition allows Year 12 students in Buckinghamshire to learn from professionals in their fields about green technologies and sustainable business practices to develop and display a range of green skills, employability, technical, creative and academic skills.

You have been allocated a business to work with. During the challenge, participating students will receive support from the business to develop their ideas.

The aims of the challenge are:

- To provide a unique, experience-based interactive challenge that gives students a practical education in collaboration, organisation and modern workplace skills.
- To raise awareness and provide solutions to environmental issues and green jobs.
- To work with local businesses on a live brief.
- To encourage innovative solutions to known problems.
- To improve students' employability skills critical thinking, time-management, collaboration, response to a live brief, listening and speaking skills, creativity, teamwork and leadership.





Green Schools Challenge

Round One: Sustainability Briefing - September

19/9/24

Students will attend a Sustainability briefing at their school / college using a presentation delivered jointly between the Bucks Skills Hub and Softcat plc, to help the students understand various "green" vocabulary, to know which business will be supporting them during the challenge, explaining the aim of the challenge and defining the team roles.

All forms should get into teams, maximum 8 people per team.

There can not be more than 2 teams per form.

Before the event in October - brainstorm ideas.

Round Two: Initial Ideas Workshop - October

8/10/24

The workshop assisted by each of the supporting businesses to their school / college.

The supporting business will give the background to their business, roles and green credentials, the green challenges they face and how they are working towards overcoming them.

Round Three: Training and Preparation for the Grand Final - November

11/11/24

The winning team from each school / college will experience a workplace visit to discover more about their supporting business, career pathways into their industry and how it is responding to green challenges. Each team will be assisted by the business to improve their solution from the idea in Round Two. Whilst visiting the business, each team will receive tips on improving their PowerPoint presentation and mentoring on how to deliver their pitch at the Grand Final.

Round Four: The Grand Final - December

2/12/24



Monday 2nd December

The competing teams will attend the Grand Final to pitch their idea to a panel of "Dragons". It will be held in the Oculus, Gateway Building, Aylesbury. The supporting businesses will be invited to attend as guests, along with other VIPs.

There will be a number of awards available to the Dragons to issue: Overall winner, Best Presentation, Most Innovative Idea, Best Team, Most Social Media Interactions, Idea likely to be Most Sustainable.

Work Experience

- All Year 12 students and students who have chose to complete WEX during enrichment week will be completing work experience from Monday, 14th to Friday, 18th July 2025
- It is the students responsibility to find a placement for the 5 days.
- Failure to secure a placement will result in the students completing a virtual work experience in school with Ms Shanahan. (This will not be optional and it will be provided for them)
