Subject: Philosophy and Ethics

Year group: Year 7

Periods per fortnight: 1

INTENT:

Philosophy and Ethics encourages us to explore and challenge our assumptions about what we are, how we think, and the nature of the world around us. In Philosophy and Ethics lessons students take the methods and tools of philosophical and ethical enquiry and apply them to contemporary beliefs and values and key issues facing the world today. How we live has a big impact on others, in terms of the relationships we cultivate, the behaviours we adopt or avoid and the principles we choose to live by. This course investigates our beliefs, values and decision-making processes and it challenges assumptions and ideas to see if they can still stand up as relevant and meaningful.
