## MAKING THE RIGHT CHOICE



If a student's behaviour disrupts the learning or is inappropriate to <u>ANY member of the school community</u>, following consequences should be applied:

All lateness to lessons is logged and	collated at the end of the week	Three lates in a week results in a 20 minute
lunchtime detention on a Tuesday.

0	Verbal warning issued	0 behaviour points given	Students are reminded of the teacher's expectations and gently encouraged to discontinue the behaviour they are displaying.
B1	Formal verbal warning for repeated low-level disruption	1 behaviour point	Repeated low-level disruption and failure to follow the code of conduct. B1 Recorded on G4S using 'drop-down' menu Monitored by Tutor/HOY
B2	On-going inappropriate behaviour	10-minute class teacher detention 2 behaviour points	Disruption continues despite previous warnings. staff runs detention at earliest opportunity, e.g. break. B2 Recorded on G4S using 'drop-down' menu Monitored by Tutor/HOY/CL Inform student when it is.
B3	Ongoing Inappropriate behaviour that continues despite previous interventions or behaviour that causes significant concern and results in an immediate removal from lesson	20-minute lunchtime detention <b>3 behaviour points</b>	Repeated intentional disruption continues despite previous signposting of B1 and B2 from the teacher. <b>Pupil removed via Rainbow Call Out system</b> to dept. member on rota to sit and work silently.
