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Dear current and prospective Sixth Form students and families,

All students should attend initial lessons with a notebook, fully-stocked pencil case. Further guidance will be given by subject teachers about what to bring, and when, to lessons.

During the day

Successful students attend lessons on time, interact positively with everyone they encounter, and actively participate in lessons.

The Buckingham School is concerned that every student should have the opportunity to attend school activities/obtain equipment, regardless of their financial circumstances. Those who make the most mistakes are the ones who have the opportunity to learn the most – and surely, we all want to learn that little bit more than those around us?
